Forming Faith in our Children is a Team Effort

We know that when kids play a sport or an instrument their chances of succeeding increases exponentially when they practice multiple times a week and when parents are involved. Parents and coaches both encourage their kids to play, do drills, and continuously improve. It's not that everyone who works hard will become a champion athlete or virtuosic musician, but with the help of coaches and parents, kids develop their identities as athletes or musicians. The same applies to shaping kids' identities as followers of Jesus. It takes a strong partnership between parents, kids, and the church to develop an impactful faith.

For the past fifty years, we've treated faith formation like education. We've tried to pass on information about God, the Bible, and church without connecting this information with opportunities for kids and parents to actually practice faith in God. We've also made it easy for families to expect that they can drop their kids off at church and the church, through staff and volunteers, will take care of teaching kids the Christian faith. Two decades of research shows that when the church is the only place people, and especially

kids, are practicing faith, it's unlikely that faith will become an important part of their lives.

The most powerful influence in our kids' faith are parents. If parents are practicing faith and talking about how God shapes their lives, faith in God grows in kids too. For many parents, this seems foreign because a lot of us didn't see parents practice faith outside of worship. So, what does this look like for families to partner with the church to grow in faith together?

The Family Ministry Staff has been exploring some new possibilities with our families. We want to help families have faith in God that matters. We see what we do as a partnership, between church and home. Like sports or music, instructors and coaches (or pastors and Family Ministry Staff) are helpful guides, but we can't do it all. A partnership between church and home enables us to more effectively pass on faith to the next generation. In the process, we believe that everyone's experience of God will be more meaningful.

Over the next year, we will be inviting families to participate in faith forming events we're calling Milestones. Together with pastors, Family Ministry Staff,



parents, and kids, we will help families develop practices that encourage a deeper faith in Jesus. This winter we will start by gathering parents with toddlers and infants together to learn the power of blessing our little ones. Rituals are an important part of making meaning in our lives. When we remind ourselves and our children of God's presence and the claim God makes on us, it has an impact on how our children see themselves. There are plenty of messages that even our youngest children hear every day. As people of faith, we want them to see themselves as beloved children of God first and foremost.

As partners in the journey of faith, we will learn from one another; and with God's help discover a faith that is not only meaningful for our kids, but meaningful for adults as well.

Building Bridges with Our Dinka Members and South Sudan

This September, we built some significant bridges with our members who come from South Sudan. Our Lay Evangelist Kamen Makuer shared his vision

to replace guns with books and pencils in his home area of South Sudan. During God's Work. Our Hands. Sunday, we packed the first school kits for the school Kamen is helping to start. It will cost several hundred dollars to get school supplies delivered to South Sudan.

This fall one of our Dinka members asked for our help to bring his wife and daughters to live with him in America. Mading Kuerishoung has been in the US for twenty years. He has been

married for the last nine years, but most of that time he and his wife Naykuer have lived an ocean apart. All the paperwork has been submitted for Naykuer to come to the US with their two small daughters. Their hope is to provide their girls a good education and a peaceful future. As of mid-October, they were still waiting for an interview in the US Embassy in Khartoum. Once the interview is granted, they will make arrangements for travel to the US. Thanks to Zumbro's generosity, there are enough funds to provide transportation. Additional funds will be needed to help them establish their home in Rochester.

We are also building bridges with our south Sudanese brothers and sisters by sending Pastor Jason to South Sudan this month. Pastor Jason will travel to South Sudan and Ethiopia to visit people being impacted by the work of the new Lutheran Church in South Sudan. While there, he will visit some of the South Sudanese living in refugee camps along the border of Ethiopia and attend the dedication of the new South

Sudan Lutheran Ministry Center in Juba. This Center houses a clinic, a church, and an adult education center that will teach people marketable skills to help them better provide for their families.

This new church is a sign of peace, hope, and reconciliation in a divided nation. Currently two pastors, one from the Dinka
