




# Mini Sabbatical

Zumbro's Personnel Manual sets forth the possibility of a sabbatical for full-time pastors and program staff after five years of employment. The goals for a sabbatical will undoubtedly vary, but most likely will involve some combination of Sabbath rest, personal and family time, continuing education, spiritual nurture, physical rejuvenation, and hopefully a little fun and adventure.

I will soon be completing my eighth year at Zumbro. A year ago I had applied for a sabbatical grant from the Lilly Foundation. This was to take place in the summer of 2016. I had grand plans to build bridges of understanding and peace in exotic places such as Tibet, Turkey, and Spain. Not only was I going to see the world, I was going to engage in various pilgrimages with Hindus, Muslims, Buddhists, and Christians. Sad to say, my grant proposal was not accepted.

As I look back on the events of last spring, the "rejection letter" from the folks at Lilly turned out to be a blessing in disguise. When I received it, I was only a few weeks away from a trip to the Mayo Clinic and the subsequent diagnosis of an auto immune disorder with a very long name: antiphospholipid antibody syndrome. And as you may recall, the discovery of six mini-strokes meant that I was going to need to focus almost all of my time and

energy on getting well.

A lot has happened since last May. Shortly after my diagnosis, my neurologist, Dr. Robert Brown, assured me that the brain has a remarkable capacity to heal, but it takes time. He encouraged me not to be impatient. Sure enough, I am feeling much better now than I did a year ago. My brain is functioning better. I'm able to handle more complex decision making. And my short-term memory loss continues to improve. Am I exactly the same as I was before? Probably not. But I'm a lot better than I was. And I'm confident that I am still healing. Know that I'm grateful for God's help and strength along the way. And I'm especially grateful for your ongoing prayers and encouragement.

Over the last few months, the Personnel Team has been nudging me to once again consider a sabbatical. I have to admit, I've been dragging my feet. In many ways, the focus and hard work of ministry have been good for my brain—taking on challenges, setting goals, and getting work done. With each new challenge, it seems I'm a little more like my old self again. And that feels incredibly good.

I have decided to meet the Personnel Team part-way. I am going to take a five-week leave or "mini-sabbatical" from May 15 to June 18. There are no scheduled



trips to exotic locations, however. Instead I plan to replace the oak flooring in my living room, read a couple of good page-turners, and hopefully play a little golf.

Thank you for providing me this opportunity. And thanks in advance to the staff and volunteers who will be covering for me while I'm away.



- 4 cloth diapers (flat fold preferred)
- 1 jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap
- 2 pairs of socks
